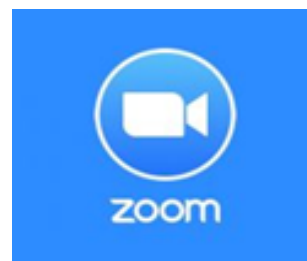

3. GPs providing tablets to people and then not following up on this.

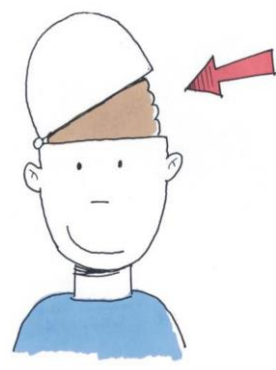

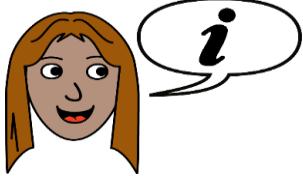


Presentation on Dementia by
Tim Sanders – Commissioning Programme Lead - Dementia and
Anna Simpson - Principal Clinical Psychologist with Learning Disabilities Services and Learning Disability and Dementia Pathway

Anna talked about what is Dementia.

- It affects all including young people
- 40 -45 if they have Learning Disability
- Need to speak to your GP if you have concerns who will then do a test.
- **Dementia workshop booklet and free webinar on Wednesday 29th Jan 12-1pm.** Sarah will send this round if anyone would like to take part. Includes a free workbook to go with the session.

Members raised issues of needing more support in Leeds regarding Learning Disability.

	Does Health use a health passport to identify Dementia? Tim said NHS has a Memory Assessment Service who undertake the test to see if you have Dementia or not. We cannot directly calculate the employment rate for people without learning disabilities from the information we have, but we know the overall rate of employment for people aged 16-64 is 73.5%. The number of people with a learning disability is small compared to the total population.* Consequently, the employment rate for people without a learning disability would be close to 73.5%. Please see below for further detail on the indicator calculation and summary table.

For this indicator, the gap in employment rate is calculated by comparing employment rate for people aged 16-64 years old with a learning disability (as defined and sourced in Rob Wood's response) to the employment rate for all people aged 16-64 years old using Annual Population Survey data. We can compare percentage employment rates from the two sources but cannot combine them to calculate employment rate for people without learning disabilities.

*2023/24 GP reported all age prevalence of Learning Disability in Leeds is 0.52% (n= 5,020 / 967,531).
